

The Mapping ODA research and innovation (MODARI) tool collates data on the UK's Official Development Assistance (ODA) spend on international development research across government departments. This briefing summarises data from the most recent MODARI update in March 2025.



The top research themes are Health, Climate and Environment, and Social Protection



Europe and Central Asia

This briefing summarises **ODA-funded research in Europe and Central Asia.** It provides a regional analysis of research projects by i) HMG funders, ii) research themes, and iii) recipient countries.


Active ODA research projects*: 1257



*One project may be active across multiple regions.

Of active ODA-funded research projects, **65%** target Europe and Central Asia. Other than the UK, **Ukraine, France,** and **the Netherlands** conduct the highest number of research projects, while **Ukraine** and **Turkey** are targeted by the highest number of projects as beneficiaries. **DSIT** funds the largest number of projects in this region, followed by FCDO and DHSC.


Social Protection is the most common regional funding theme, followed by Health and Climate and Environment.



United Kingdom

This briefing summarises **ODA-funded research in the United Kingdom.** It provides a regional analysis of research projects by i) HMG funders, ii) research themes, and iii) recipient countries.






*One project may be active across multiple regions.

Of active ODA-funded research projects, **61%** involve organisations based in the United Kingdom. While **DSIT** funds the highest amount of UK projects, the top delivery partners are **FCDO**, the British Academy, and the National Institute for Health and Care Research. While this summary focuses on the United Kingdom, many of these projects are a collaboration with partners in the Global South to deliver ODA-funded research.

Social Protection is the most common regional funding theme, followed by Health, and Climate and Environment. This spread aligns with European regional funding themes. UKCDR is working to increase the accuracy of themes in upcoming MODARI updates.



Sub-Saharan Africa

This briefing summarises **ODA-funded research in Sub-Saharan Africa.** It provides a regional analysis of research projects by i) HMG funders, ii) research themes, and iii) recipient countries.






*One project may be active across multiple regions.

Of active ODA-funded research projects, **45%** target Sub-Saharan Africa. **Uganda, Kenya**, and **Nigeria** participate in and are targeted by the highest number of research projects as beneficiaries. **DHSC** is the top funder in this region, followed by FCDO and DSIT.

Health is the most common regional funding theme, followed by Climate and Environment, and Unknown. In addition to health, gender equality projects comprise a higher proportion of overall funded projects in these region when compared to others.



This briefing summarises **ODA-funded research in North America.** It provides a regional analysis of research projects by i) HMG funders, ii) research themes, and iii) recipient countries.



Of active ODA-funded research projects, **14%** involve North America, and the **United States** is involved in the highest number of projects followed by **Canada**. **FCDO** funds the largest number of projects in this region, followed by DHSC.


Climate and Environment is the most common regional funding theme, followed by Health and Agriculture. Climate and environment and agricultural projects comprise a higher proportion of overall funded projects in these region when compared to others.



South Asia

This briefing summarises **ODA-funded research in South Asia**. It provides a regional analysis of research projects by i) HMG funders, ii) research themes, and iii) recipient countries.


Active ODA research projects*: **265**

Of active ODA-funded research projects, **14%** target South Asia. **India**, **Nepal**, and **Bangladesh** are involved in the highest number of research projects. **FCDO** funds the largest number of projects in this region, followed by DHSC and Defra.

Health is the most common regional funding theme, followed by Climate and Environment and Governance. More projects target governance as a proportion of the total number of active projects in a region here than in any other region.




Active ODA research projects*: **260**

Of active ODA-funded research projects, **13%** target East Asia and the Pacific. **Indonesia, Vietnam**, and the **Philippines** both participate in and are targeted by the most research projects as beneficiaries. **DSIT** funds the largest number of projects in this region, followed by FCDO and DHSC.


Climate and Environment is the most common regional funding theme, followed by Health and Education.


Active ODA research projects*: 120

Of active ODA-funded research projects, **6%** target Latin America and the Caribbean, and **Brazil, Colombia**, and **Mexico** both participate in and are targeted by the most research projects as beneficiaries. **DHSC** funds the largest number of projects in this region, followed by DSIT and FCDO.

Health is the most common regional funding theme, followed by Climate and Environment and Social Protection. More projects target Energy as a proportion of the total number of active projects in a region here than in any other region.




Active ODA research projects*: 87



*One project may be active across multiple regions.

Of active ODA-funded research projects, just **5%** target the Middle East and North Africa. **Jordan, Syria, Lebanon,** and **Egypt** both participate in and are targeted by the most research projects. **FCDO** funds the largest number of projects in this region, followed by DSIT.


Education is the most common regional funding theme, followed by Health, Violence, and Climate and Environment. More projects target education, humanitarian issues, infrastructure, and violence as a proportion of the total number of active projects in a region here than in any other region.

MODARI Gap Map

The Gap Map shows the spread of ODA-funded research projects across themes and regions.* There is a clear concentration of ODA-funded research on Health in Sub-Saharan Africa and Social Protection and Climate and the environment in Europe and Central Asia.

Across all regions, fewer infrastructure projects are being funded. There are also fewer projects targeting MENA and Latin America and the Caribbean.

MODARI Data Notes

Completeness – Some fields on country information and names/countries of partner organisations are missing from the MODARI dataset. While the information sourced from funders and open access databases may not be complete, there is ongoing work to increase coverage across UK government funders and delivery partners.

Spend figures – Due to limited availability of partner project data for FCDO projects, both funder and partner data have been included in the dataset to avoid information gaps. To mitigate spend inflation, FCDO partner entries are not included in this analysis.

Regional project count – Where one project targets more than one region, it will be included in the project count and summary briefing for each of those regions. For example, if a project targets China and India, it will be included in the regional summary for East Asia and the Pacific and South Asia.

Themes – The most recent MODARI update (March 2025) tagged each project against only one theme. For projects working across multiple themes or similar themes, this might make it appear that some topics are being funded at lower levels than expected. To mitigate this, we have grouped the 12 MODARI theme tags into 8 master themes for analysis in the Gap Map (table 1).
